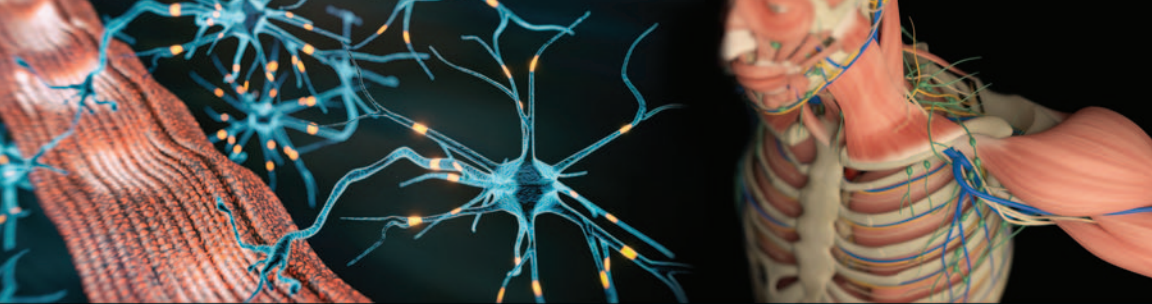
LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon conclusion of this educational activity, the participant will be better able to:

- Review novel treatments for spinal muscular atrophy (SMA) and amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), including recently approved therapies and emerging clinical trial data.
- Discuss emerging therapies and evolving standards of care for autoimmune neuropathies.
- Describe recent advances in the diagnosis and treatment of hereditary neuropathies and hATTR amyloidosis.
- Discuss challenging clinical cases to enhance diagnostic reasoning and management strategies in neuromuscular disorders.
- Explain current approaches to the diagnosis and targeted treatment of autoimmune myopathies.
- Evaluate the role and recent advances of gene therapy in the treatment of neuromuscular diseases.
- Describe the evolving treatment landscape for hereditary muscular dystrophies, including newly approved and emerging therapies.
- Describe novel immunotherapies for myasthenia gravis (MG) and Lambert-Eaton Myasthenic Syndrome (LEMS) and their mechanisms of action.
- Interpret antibody testing in Guillain-Barré Syndrome (GBS), CIDP, and autoimmune neuropathies, including clinical pearls and pitfalls.

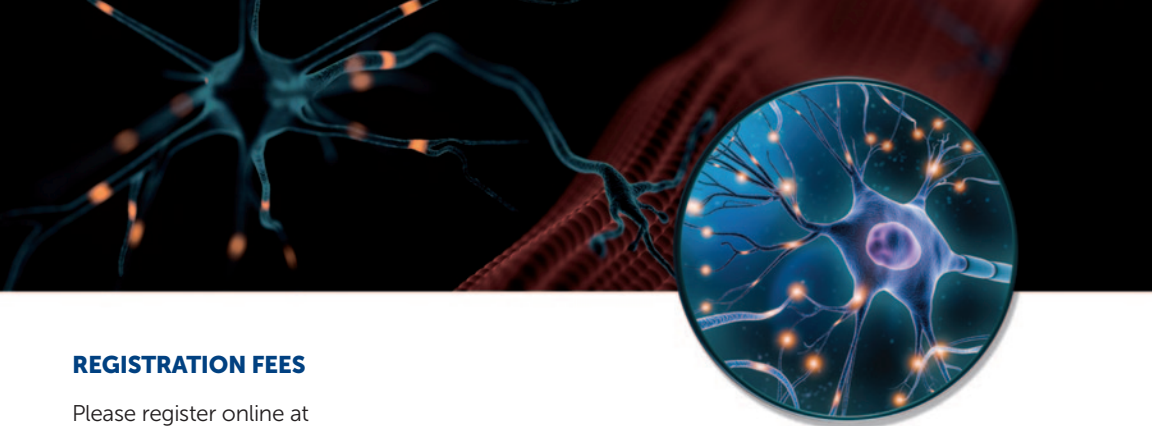
CANCELLATION POLICY

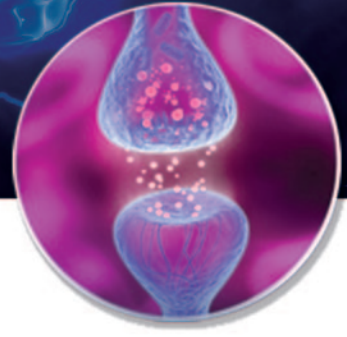
