Program Overview & Target Audience

Glomerular disease is associated with morbidity and mortality in patients of all ages and is a common cause of end stage kidney disease. These include those that commonly present with nephrotic syndrome (minimal change disease, FSGS and membranous nephropathy), the nephrotic syndrome (vasculitis, lupus nephritis and IgA nephropathy), among others. Treatment often utilizes immunosuppressive regimens such as high dose corticosteroids, alkylating agents, calcineurin inhibitors, biologics and antimetabolites, which are associated with significant side effects and morbidity. Thus, glomerular diseases present a difficult and unique challenge to both patients and nephrologists and are associated with high treatment costs and historically, have had poor renal outcomes. There have been significant recent advances in the field in both the diagnosis and treatment of glomerular diseases, and the current guidelines for managing glomerular disease require updating. It is important for physicians to stay current with these new approaches to managing glomerular diseases.

This program has been designed for nephrologists and will address the latest updates and significant challenges of glomerular disease. A combination of case presentations and lectures will be used to provide an academically sound and clinically relevant review.

Course Objectives:

At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Leverage ongoing clinical trials to improve treatment options for IgA nephropathy
- Discuss the use of genetic testing in patients with FSGS
- Review the complexities of diagnosing tubulointerstitial disease
- Discuss recent data on the treatment of lupus nephritis
- Explain how recent randomized controlled trials in ANCA associated vasculitis are informing clinical management of this disease
- Demonstrate expertise in diagnosing and treating membranous nephropathy in 2021
- Employ a culture among our community to reduce practice variability and make strides in improving patient outcomes
